## CAP. XL.

An Act to incorporate the Town of Moncton.

Town incorporated; bounds of Town.

2 Number and boundaries of Wards. 3 Administration of Local Govern-ment, &c. of Town, in whom

vested; Councillors to be elected. Chairman and Councillors to be ex officio Justices of the Peace.

Chairman to be chosen annually, by whom; proviso.

Elector to vote in the ward where he resides; where non-residents shall vote.

Ward. What Acts or parts of Acts repealed when Act shall come into operation.

Passed 10th April, 1875.

BE it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly, as follows:—

1. That from and after the passing of this Act, all the inhabitants of that part of the Parish of Moncton which is bounded as follows, namely: - Commencing on the Petitcodiac River at the mouth of Jonathan Creek, in said Parish of Moncton; thence following the course of the Petitcodia: River eastwardly to the mouth of Hall's Creek; thence following the several windings of the west branch of Hall's Creek until it strikes the east line of the Milner lot, (so called); thence in a southwest direction to the west boundary of lands now occupied by Charles Jones, and at a point where the said line crosses said Jonathan Creek; thence following the said Jonathan Creek along its various windings southerly to the place of beginning; shall be a Town corporate in right and in name, by the name of "The Town of Moncton," and shall hav: perpetual succession and a common seal, with power to break, renew and alter the same at pleasure, and shall be capable in law of suing and being sued, and of purchasing and holding lands and tenements for the use of the said inhabitants, and of making and entering into such contracts and agreements as may be necessary for the exercise of their corporate functions, and to do and execute every other matter or thing incident to such Corporation, subject to the provisions hereinafter contained.

2. That the said Town of Moncton shall be and is hereby divided into three Wards, viz:-Ward number one, Ward number two, and Ward number three, to be severally bounded as follows:-Ward number one bounded on the north and east by Hall's Creek, southerly by the Petitcodiac River, and westerly by the centre of Telegraph street and the Great Road to Robertson's bridge (so called) crossing said Creek; Ward number two bounded easterly by Ward number one, southerly by the river, westerly by a straight line running from the river, northerly through the centre of the new street lately opened by G. B. Lutz to Hall's Creek. and on the north by Hall's Creek; Ward number three bounded on the east by Ward number two, on the south by the river, on the west by the westerly boundary of the

Town, and on the north by Hall's Creek.

3. The administration of the fiscal, prudential and municipal affairs, and the whole local government of the said Town of Moncton, shall be vested in one principal officer, who shall be Chairman of the Town Council, and in six other persons, two of whom shall be elected for each Ward as hereinafter provided, and who shall be styled Councillors of the Town of Moncton, and in no other power or authority whatever. and the said Chairman and Councillors shall constitute the Town Council; and all bye-laws, ordinances, rules and regulations made by the said Council shall express to be ordained by the Town Council of the Town of Moncton.

4. The Chairman of the Town Council and each one of the said Councillors shall during his and their continuance in office be and be deemed to be Justices of the Peace in and for the said County of Westmorland, and shall have, use, exercise and enjoy in and out of Sessions the same rights. powers and authorities, privileges and immunities respectively, as if he or they had been commissioned a Justice or Justices of the Peace; provided that no person shall be disqualified for election or appointment as a Councillor or Chairman by reason of his already being in the Commission of the Peace for the said County, or being after any such election or appointment commissioned thereto, nor shall the Town Council in their choice aforesaid be limited to or excluded from choosing any such person.
