#### CAP. I.

An Act to alter the time for holding the Circuit Court in the County of Albert.

Passed 29th February 1876.

BE it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly,-

That the Circuit Court in and for the County of Albert shall hereafter be held on the second Tuesday in July in each year, instead of on the first Tuesday in March as provided by an Act made and passed in the thirty eighth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled An Act relating to the holding of Circuit Courts in the different Counties of this Province.

## CAP. II.

An Act relating to the engrossment of Acts of the Legislature.

Passed 29th February 1876.

BE it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly,-

That every Act of the Legislature may be engrossed on Paper; and every Act so engrossed on Paper shall be as valid in all respects as if the same had been engrossed on Parchment according to the practice in that respect hitherto obtaining in this Province.
