Downing Street, 8th Nov. 1876.

SIR,—I have the honor to transmit to you for your information and for publication in the Colony under your Government, a copy of an Order of Her Majesty in Council, dated the 23rd October 1876, providing for the apprehension of Deserters from Merchant Ships belonging to the Kingdom of Hawaii, under the "Foreign Deserters Act, I have the honor to be, Sir, 1852.

## AT THE COURT AT BALMORAL, The 23rd day of October 1876.

PRESENT:

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the "Foreign Deserters Act, 1852," it is provided that whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities are or will be given for recovering or apprehending Seamen who desert from British Merchant Ships in the territories of any Foreign power, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that Seamen, not being slaves, who desert from Merchant

ships belonging to such power when within Her Majesty's dominions shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships, and may limit the operation of such Order, and may render the operation thereof subject to such conditions and qualifications, if any, as may be deemed expedient; and whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities are given for recovering and apprehending Seamen who desert from British ships in the territories of His Majesty the King of Hawaii ;-

Now Therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by the said "Foreign Deserters Act, 1852," and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that from and after the publication hereof in the London Gazette, Seamen not being slaves, and not being British subjects, who within Her Majesty's dominions desert from Merchant ships belonging to the Kingdom of Hawaii, shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships.

Provided always, that if any such Deserter has committed any crime in Her Majesty's dominions, he may be detained until he has been tried by a competent Court, and until his sentence (if any) has been fully carried into effect.

And the Secretaries of State for India in Council, the Home Department, and the Colonies, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
