LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CHAMBER,

FREDERICTON, FRIDAY, 16th March, 1877.

THIS day, at one o'clock, His Honor The Honorable SAMUEL LEONARD TILLEY, C. B., Lieutenant Governor of the Province of New Brunswick, came to the Council Chamber, and being seated on the Throne, commanded the attendance of the House of Assembly; who being come, His Honor was pleased to close the Session with the following

SPEECH:

" Mr. President, and Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

"Mr. Speaker, and Gentlemen of the House of Assembly,

"The diligence with which you have discharged your Legislative duties during the present

Session, enables me to release you from further attendance, earlier than usual.

- "One of my predecessors, in his Speech, when proroguing the Legislature in 1851, said— 'I rejoice sincerely to find, that the first step has been made towards the general introduc-'tion of Municipal Institutions throughout the Province.' It has been my pleasure to give my assent to the Bill completing the work then begun, and by which the ratepayers in all parts of the Province are invested with the control and management of their local affairs.

- "I thank you for the liberality which has characterized your appropriations for the Public Service; it shall be my care to see that the sums thus granted are expended in conformity with your wishes.

"In relieving you from your labours, I recur with satisfaction to the unanimity and devotion to the public welfare which has characterized your proceedings. In returning to your homes, I assure you that you will carry with you my best wishes for your individual prosperity and happiness."
