SEALED TENDERS, indorsed "*Tenders for Reporting the Debates of the Assembly*," and addressed to the Chief Commissioner of the Board of Works, will be received by the undersigned Committee of the Executive Council, at the Office of the Board of Works, Fredericton, until the twentieth day of November next, at 12 o'clock, noon, for the Synoptic Reporting and Publishing the Debates of the House of Assembly during the continuance of the present House, according to the directions and Specification on file in the Office of the Board of Works.

Also: Separate Sealed Tenders, indorsed "*Tenders for Departmental Printing*," for Printing and Binding the Reports of certain Departments and Public Offices of the Government, for the Year ending 31st October, 1878, according to the directions and Specification on file in the Office of the Board of Works.

The Tenders in each case must contain the actual signature of two responsible persons willing to become Sureties for the faithful performance of the Contract—otherwise the Tender will not be considered; and the Committee reserve the right to prescribe other provisions for the due completion of each Contract.

## GENERAL RULES

OF THE

## ELECTION COURT

### For the Province of New Brunswick;

Made under and by virtue of the Act of the Dominion of Canada passed in the 37th year of Her Majesty's Reign, Chapter 10, being "*The Dominion Controverted Elections Act, 1874.*"

### I.

An Election Petition shall contain the following statements:—

- (a) The right of the Petitioner to petition within Section seven of the Act;
- (b) The holding and result of the Election;
- (c) A brief statement of the facts and grounds relied on to sustain the prayer:

And shall conclude with a prayer for such relief as the Petitioner claims to be entitled to.
