#### A PROCLAMATION.

**W**HEREAS by Royal Proclamation dated at Windsor Castle on the twenty second day of May one thousand eight hundred and sixty seven, Her Most Gracious Majesty did ordain, declare and command that on and after the first day of July one thousand eight hundred and sixty seven, the Provinces of Canada, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick should form and become a Dominion, under the name of CANADA:

And whereas the Anniversary of the formation of the Dominion of Canada falls upon Monday the first day of July next ensuing; and whereas it is meet and proper that the said Anniversary should be observed and kept;—

Now KNOW YE, that I do hereby proclaim and appoint MONDAY the first day of July next, as a General Holiday; and I do hereby enjoin and call upon all Her Majesty's loving subjects throughout the Province on that day to join in the due and proper celebration and observance of the said Anniversary.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the nineteenth day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy eight, and in the forty first year of Her Majesty's Reign.

These Regulations have been issued by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty during the revision of the "Queen's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions," and have been concurred in by this Department.

#### CHAPTER XIX.

Interchange of Visits between Officers of Her Majesty's Ships and Governors, Lieutenant Governors, Administrators, and Presidents of Colonies.

1. A Governor to receive the first visit from all Naval Officers in command.

2. A Lieutenant Governor to pay the first visit to a Flag Officer or Commodore of the 1st Class, being a Commander in Chief, but to receive the first visit from all other Officers.

3. An Administrator or President to pay the first visit to all Flag Officers or Commodores, but to receive the first visit from all other Officers.

4. Return visits to be paid within twenty four hours, and in person, to all Flag Officers, Commodores, Lieutenant Governors, Administrators, and Presidents; but by an Aide-de-Camp or other Officer deputed by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Administrator, or President, as the case may be, to all other Naval Officers.

5. Boats to be furnished from Her Majesty's Ships when required, as in the case of Consuls.
