In Quebec and Manitoba the Notice is to be published in the

English and French languages.

Every applicant for a Private Bill is required, eight days before the opening of Parliament, to deposit with the Clerk of the House in which the Bill is to originate, a copy of such Bill, with a sum sufficient to pay for the translation and printing of the same. Between the second reading of the Bill and its considera-tion by the committee to whom it is referred, the applicant is to pay a fee of \$200, besides the cost of printing the Act in the

No Petition for a Private Bill is received by either House after the expiration of the first ten days of the Session.
