#### PROCLAMATION.

HEREAS it hath pleased Almighty God of His great mercy to crown the labors of the Husbandman with an abundant Harvest, and to bestow upon the People of this Province manifold and great blessings during the current year;—

All Timber, Logs or other Lumber cut upon Unicensed Crown Land or which may be cut by any person beyond the limits of his own Berth, shall be seized and forfeited to the use of the Crown; and no Timber or Lumber shall be cut on any Berth applied for until it shall be purchased at Public Auction. current year ;-

I do therefore appoint THURSDAY the twentieth day of No. October instant, as a Day of Thanksgiving, and recommend 75 the general observance thereof throughout this Province.

And I do also hereby appoint and proclaim the said twentieth day of October a Public Holiday.
