THE attention of all AUCTIONEERS is again called to the following Sections of Chapter 94 of The Consolidated Statutes, page 740; and they are required to govern themselves accordingly:—

“4. Every Auctioneer who shall not within thirty days from the end of every three months render to the Receiver General an Account in writing on Oath (B) as in the Schedule hereto, of all Auction Sales by him, and pay the duties thereon to such Officer, shall for each omission be liable to a penalty of two hundred dollars. The Oath provided in this Section may be administered by any Justice of the Peace of the County where the party attending may reside.

“5. The Receiver General shall require such Accounts to be regularly furnished, and proceedings to be instituted if neglected and shall keep a book of Entries of all moneys received for Auction duties.”
