PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by Royal Proclamation dated at Windsor Castle on the twenty second day of May one thousand eight hundred and sixty seven, Her Most Gracious Majesty did ordain, declare and command that on and after the first day of July then next the Provinces of Canada, Nova Scotia, and New Brunswick, should form and become a Dominion, under the name of CANADA;

And whereas the Anniversary of the formation of the Dominion of Canada falls upon FRIDAY the first day of July next ensuing, and it is meet and proper the said Anniversary should be observed and kept;—

Now Know Ye, that I do hereby proclaim and appoint FRIDAY the first day of July next, a General Holiday, and I do hereby enjoin and call upon all Her Majesty's loving subjects throughout the Province to join in the due and proper celebration and observance of the said Anniversary.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the fifteenth day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty one, and in the forty fourth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

PHYSICIANS AND SURGEONS, and all other persons, entitled and claiming to register under the provisions of the Act of the General Assembly 44 Victoria, Chapter XIX, intituled "An Act relating to the Registration and Qualification of Physicians and Surgeons," (see *Royal Gazette*, April 20th, 1881), are hereby notified to file a Memorandum of their names, and place of residence and practice, with their Post Office Address, in this Office, on or before the 25th day of June next, as required by the said Act, and otherwise to comply with the provisions of the said Act.

Non-resident regular Practitioners of Medicine residing in the State of Maine, or in the Provinces of Quebec or Nova Scotia, near the boundary line of this Province, whose business extends into any Town, Parish or County in New Brunswick, may register under the provisions of this Act.
