An Act in amendment of the Law relating to Top Wharfage in the City and County of Saint John.

1 Schedule A of 18 Vic., Cap. 41, repealed, and new Schedule substituted: Proviso.
2 Rates and charges to be as in Schedule hereto attached.

3, 4 Rates and charges in Schedule attached, how recoverable.
5 When half rates of Top Wharfage may be charged. Schedule.

Passed 3rd May 1883.

BE it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly, as follows:—

1. The Schedule A to an Act made and passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, Chapter 41, intituled *An Act to continue and amend an Act to regulate Dockage, Wharfage and Cranage in the City of Saint John and in the Parish of Portland*, and the rates and charges set forth in the said Schedule, are hereby repealed, and the Schedule appended to this Act is substituted in lieu thereof; provided that this repeal shall not affect the right to recover any claim for top wharfage accruing before the passing of this Act, but the same shall and may be prosecuted and recovered as if this Act had not been passed.

2. From and after the passing of this Act the several rates and charges mentioned and set forth in the Schedule appended to this Act shall be the rates and charges of wharfage or top wharfage, so called, recoverable under the provisions of the Act mentioned in the first Section of this Act, and of any Act amending the same, in the same manner and to the same extent as if the Schedule hereunto appended had originally been the Schedule A appended to said first mentioned Act.

3. The several rates and charges mentioned and set forth in the Schedule appended to this Act shall also be the rates and charges of top wharfage, receivable and recoverable under the provisions of an Act passed in the thirty second year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, Chapter 60, intituled *An Act relating to the North and South Market Wharves in the City of Saint John*, and also under the provisions of an Act made and passed in the thirty fourth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, Chapter 23, intituled *An Act relating to the Public Wharves in the City of Saint John*: All the provisions of the third, fourth, fifth, and sixth Sections of the said Act mentioned in the first Section of this Act, 18th Victoria, Chapter 41, shall extend and apply to the said Acts mentioned and referred to in this Section, and to each of them; and the several provisions of the said third, fourth, fifth, and sixth Sections shall be applied, construed, deemed and taken to belong to the Acts in this Section mentioned, as if enacted therein respectively; and it shall not be required that the public wharves and roadways be planked or timbered on the surface.

4. The several rates and charges mentioned and set forth in the Schedule appended to this Act shall also be the rates and charges of top wharfage receivable and recoverable under the provisions of the second Section of an Act passed in the thirty seventh year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, Chapter 66, intituled *An Act to enable the owners of a certain*

Wharf in Saint Martins to collect Dockage and To for the use of the same.

5. Whenever horse or other power is used in and fro on the surface of a wharf to assist in the unloading of any vessel lying at or near a wharf, in every such case one half the Schedule Top Wharfage shall be receivable and recover articles so laden or discharged.

Crates, casks and cases of Glass and Earthenware, per ton of 40 cubic feet, each ...	ten cents.
Barrels of the same, each ...	one cent.
Carriages and Coaches, each ...	ten cents.
Carboys, each ...	one cent.
Clay and Chalk per ton of 2240 lbs., ...	ten cents.
Cattle, viz., Bulls, Oxen and Cows, each ...	ten cents.
Cattle, viz., Heifers, Calves, Sheep and Lambs, each ...	two cents.
Coffee, Cocoa, Nuts, Walnuts, and other kinds of Nuts and Filberts in bags, each bag ...	one cent.
