THE SUPREME COURT IN EQUITY.

Between Norman Robertson, Plaintiff; and

Thomas R. Jones and Robert T. A. Scott, Defendants.

WHEREAS it has been made to appear by affidavit to the satisfaction of me, the undersigned, one of the Judges of the Supreme Court, that Robert T. A.
