HEMLOCK BARK LANDS.

CROWN LAND OFFICE, 9th May, 1883.

THE following Regulations regarding the disposal of Licenses for Hemlock have been approved in Council, and applications for Licenses to cut and carry away Hemlock will now be received at this Office subject thereto:—

1. Applications to be made in the usual form for Timber Licenses.
2. All Licenses for Hemlock will expire on the 31st day of March in each year.
3. Each application for License must be for not less than two (2) nor more than six (6) square miles, and the upset mileage at the rate of \$8.00 per square mile, must accompany the application.
4. The Stumpage charged will be at the rate of \$1.00 per thousand superficial feet of logs cut, and the Bark is not to be removed from the landings until the Stumpage has been paid.
5. In settling the Stumpage the mileage of \$8.00 per square mile will be credited for all Licenses actually operated on.
6. The Licensee is prohibited from unnecessarily destroying other growing trees on his License, and in case of violation of this Section the License to be forfeited and the Bark subject to seizure.
