GILCHRIST EDUCATIONAL TRUST.

Earl Derby to the Governor General.

Downing Street, 21st March, 1884.

My LORD,—I have the honor to inform you that a letter has been received in this Department from the Trustees of the Gilchrist Educational Trust, stating that, having revised their entire scheme of Scholarships, they have not found the results of that assigned to Canada sufficiently satisfactory to justify the continued expenditure of the three hundred pounds per annum required for its maintenance. They have therefore de-cided that after the election of a new Canadian scholar which will follow the Matriculation Examination of June next, no further election shall be made to this Scholarship.
