## GOVERNMENT NOTICE.

Under Chapter 98 of the Consolidated Statutes.

THESE are to certify that Wales R. Stockbridge, E. G. Byam, Edward Kavanah, of Boston, and Darius A. Martin, of Chelsea, in the State of Massachusetts, and J. H. Harding, of the City and County of Saint John, in the Province of New Brunswick, have filed in the Office of the Provincial Secretary a Memorandum of Association for the incorporation of a Company to be styled "The Brunswick Manganese Company." No refund of Mileage.

Not to interfere with any recorded sales of land not yet declared cancelled for non-compliance with the Regulations, nor with any Lots now actually occupied and improved to the present value of one hundred dollars, nor with any Lots reserved under applications for which Returns of Survey were received at this Office previous to the date of application for License.

All Timber, Logs or other Lumber cut upon Unlicensed Crown Land or which may be cut by any person beyond the limits of his own Berth, shall be seized and forfeited to the use of the Crown; and no Timber or Lumber shall be cut on any Berth applied for until it shall be purchased at Public Auction.
