Now Know YE, that I do hereby proclaim and appoint TUESDAY the first day of July next, a General Holiday, and I do hereby enjoin and call upon all Her Majesty's loving subjects throughout the l'rovince to join in the due and proper celebration and observance of the said Anniversary.
