THE SUPREME COURT IN EQUITY.

Between Thomas Thompson, Plaintiff; and
John Ferguson, Thomas L. Simmons and Mary Ann Simmons his Wife, Patrick M'Ewan and Elizabeth M'Ewan his Wife, William Upton and Hannah Upton his Wife, Defendants.

WHEREAS it has been made to appear by affidavit to the satisfaction of me, the undersigned, one of the Judges of the Supreme Court, that Patrick M'Ewan, one of the above defendants, does not reside within the Province, so that he cannot be served with a Summons, and that his place of residence is unknown to the plaintiff, and that the above plaintiff has good prima facie grounds for filing a Bill against the above defendants: I do therefore hereby order, that the said defendant, Patrick M'Ewan, on or before the twenty ninth day of April next, do enter an appearance in this suit, (if he intend to defend the same), wherein a Bill will be filed against the above named defendants by the above named plaintiff, for the foreclosure and sale of mortgaged Premises mentioned in a certain Indenture of Mortgage dated the twenty third day of September, A. D. 1858, made and given by John Ferguson and Phebe his Wife, (both since deceased), to Thomas Harrison, (since deceased), and assigned by William Harrison and Moses C. Harrison, Executors of the last Will and Testament of the said Thomas Harrison, to plaintiff, by Indenture dated the twenty first day of July, A.
