PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that there will be sold by Public Auction, in separate lots, at ten o'clock in the forenoon of the fourteenth day of February next, in front of Lawson's Way Office, so called, in the Parish of Johnston, in the County of Queen's, pursuant to an Order of His Honor the Judge in Equity, bearing date the thirtieth day of November, A.
