THE SUPREME COURT IN EQUITY.

Between Arthur Everitt, Plaintiff; and
Thomas Scott, Andrew Myles and Fannie Myles his wife,
Thomas H. Lawson and Sarah J. Lawson his wife, William Campbell and Annie Campbell his wife, James Campbell, Lewis Daniels and Mary Jane Daniels his wife, Defendants.

WHEREAS it has been made to appear by affidavit to the satisfaction of me, the undersigned, one of the Judges of the Supreme Court, that Lewis Daniels and Mary Jane Daniels, two of the above defendants, do not reside within the Province, so that they cannot be served with a Summons, and that their place of residence is unknown to the plaintiff, and that the above plaintiff has good *prima facie* grounds for filing a Bill against the above defendants, Lewis Daniels and Mary Jane Daniels: I do therefore hereby order, that the said defendants, Lewis Daniels and Mary Jane Daniels his wife, on or before the seventeenth day of June next, do enter an appearance in this suit, (if they intend to defend the same), wherein a Bill will be filed against the above named defendants by the above named plaintiff, for the partition and division of a certain lot, piece and parcel of Land situate, lying and being in the Parish of Lancaster, in the City and County of Saint John, being the same lot of land heretofore conveyed by one Charles H. Rice to Elizabeth Scott, widow of the late William Scott, Thomas Scott, and Joseph Scott, by Deed bearing date the seventh day of November, A.
