New Timber Applications.

CROWN LAND OFFICE, 16th Jan. 1884.

LICENSES to expire on the 1st August 1884, for the following Timber Berths, for the purpose of cutting all classes of Lumber, except Hemlock, until the 31st of March next, and from that date (being the expiry of the Hemlock Licenses) these Licenses to cover Hemlock as well as other Lumber, will be sold at this Office at noon on Wednesday the thirtieth day of January instant, subject to existing Regulations.

Upset price, \$8.00 per square mile, in addition to Stumpage.
No refund of Mileage.

Not to interfere with any recorded sales of land not yet declared cancelled for non-compliance with the Regulations, nor with any Lots now actually occupied and improved to the present value of one hundred dollars, nor with any Lots reserved under applications for which Returns of Survey were received at this Office previous to the date of application for License.

All Timber, Logs or other Lumber cut upon Uncicensed Crown Land or which may be cut by any person beyond the limits of his own Berth, shall be seized and forfeited to the use of the Crown; and no Timber or Lumber shall be cut on any Berth applied for until it shall be purchased at Public Auction.
