WHEREAS the General Assembly of this Province stands prorogued to Thursday the nineteenth day of November instant, I have thought fit further to prorogue the said General Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued accordingly to Thursday the thirty first day of December next.

GOVERNMENT NOTICE.

SMALLPOX REGULATIONS.

The following Rules, Orders and Regulations have been made and passed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council, by Order in Council bearing date the 20th day of November, A. D. 1885, under and by virtue of the provisions of Chapter 104 of the Consolidated Statutes, to prevent the introduction and spreading of Smallpox within this Province, an infectious disease within the meaning of the said Act of Assembly, and in relation to compulsory vaccination or re-vaccination in certain of the Parishes of this Province, and generally in protection of the public health:—

1. One or more Health Officers, with such Assistants as shall be required, may be appointed by the Governor in Council for the Counties of Restigouche, Madawaska, and Westmorland.

2. Any Health Officer appointed for the County of Restigouche may enter any Car running on the Intercolonial Railway which shall be coming into this Province from the Province of Quebec, and may examine any person thereon to ascertain whether he or she has been recently vaccinated, or has had the Smallpox, and may vaccinate any person he shall deem necessary, detaining any such person a sufficient length of time for the purpose; and he may, if he believes the person comes from a district infected with Smallpox, cause the baggage of such person to be disinfected.

3. Any Health Officer or Officers appointed for the County of Madawaska, is or are hereby authorized and required to stop every person on the New Brunswick side of the Boundary Line, between Quebec and this Province, coming into

the Province by the highway road leading from River du Loup to Edmundston, and not known to the Officers as a person not requiring inspection, and shall examine such person to ascertain if such person has been recently vaccinated or has had Smallpox, and if found necessary, from such examination, shall vaccinate such person, detaining him or her a sufficient length of time for the purpose; and if the Health Officer believes the person comes from a district infected with Smallpox, he shall, if such person has any luggage or other goods with him or her, cause such luggage or goods to be disinfected.

4. The Health Officer, if any, appointed for the County of Westmorland, is hereby invested with the same power and authority to examine and vaccinate persons coming into the Province from the Island of Prince Edward, as are conferred upon the Officers appointed or to be appointed for the Counties of Restigouche and Madawaska.

5. The Health Officers appointed under these Regulations are hereby invested with all the powers and authorities possessed by any Health Officer or Member of a Board of Health appointed under any of the provisions of Chapter 104 of the Consolidated Statutes.

6. Any traveller or passenger or other person refusing to allow himself or herself to be examined for the purpose of ascertaining whether such person has been recently vaccinated, as herein prescribed, or being questioned as to the locality from which he has come, refuses to answer or answers untruthfully, and any person refusing to allow himself or herself to be vaccinated on the request of the Health Officer, or to have his or her luggage or goods disinfected when required by the Health Officer or his Assistants, or any person who shall interfere with or obstruct any Health Officer or Assistant, or either of them, in the discharge of his or their duty as such Health Officer or Assistant, in each or either and any such case be liable to a penalty of Twenty Dollars.

GOVERNMENT NOTICE.

Made and passed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council, under the authority of Chapter 104 of the Consolidated Statutes, this twenty fifth day of November, A. D. 1885, in addition to any and all Orders, Rules and Regulations hitherto made and ordained by the Lieutenant Governor in Council.
