GENERAL RULES.

EASTER TERM, 1885.

1. It is ordered that Rule 1 of Michaelmas Term 1876, relating to County Court Appeals, be rescinded, and the following Rule be substituted therefor:—

That the Appellant from the decision of a Judge of a County Court shall enter the cause on the Appeal Paper of the Term immediately succeeding the receipt of the proceedings by the Clerk of the Pleas; but when any such proceedings are received after the opening of the Court in any Term, the causes shall be entered by the Appellant on the Appeal Paper of the next succeeding Term. [See Earle's Rules, 195.]

2. It is ordered, that the Stamp now used in the Office of the Clerk of the Pleas, bearing the representation of a Crown encircled with the words "*Sigil. Cur. Sup. Nov. Bruns.*" may be used as the Seal of the Court upon all writs, processes and other documents required to be under Seal, either on the Crown side, or on the Common Law or Equity sides of the Court.
