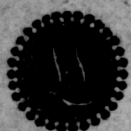

GOVERNMENT NOTICE.

His Honor the Lieutenant Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Orders respecting the Incorporation of Companies by Letters Patent under the Act 48th Victoria, Chapter 9:—

1. The Honorable the Provincial Secretary is hereby designated as the Officer charged with the issue of Letters Patent and Supplementary Letters Patent; and the Department of the Honorable the Provincial Secretary as the Department through which such issue shall take place.

2. The signatures of the Subscribers to the Petition for Letters Patent or Supplementary Letters Patent, or to the Memorandum of Association, shall be verified by affidavit to the satisfaction of the Provincial Secretary.

3. The forms in Schedule, A, B and C, are hereby approved and adopted as the forms to be used under Sections five, eleven and sixteen of the said Act respectively.

4. The following is the Schedule of Fees payable under the 87th Section of the said Act:—

- (1) When the proposed Capital Stock of the Company is \$10,000 or less, the Fee to be Twenty dollars, (\$20.00).

- (2) When the proposed Capital Stock of the Company is \$10,000 and less than \$25,000, the Fee to be Twenty five dollars, (\$25.00).
- (3) When the proposed Capital Stock of the Company is \$25,000 and less than \$50,000, the Fee to be Thirty dollars, (\$30.00).
- (4) When the proposed Capital Stock of the Company is \$50,000 and less than \$100,000, the Fee to be Forty dollars, (\$40.00).
- (5) When the proposed Capital Stock of the Company is \$100,000 and less than \$200,000, the Fee to be Sixty dollars, (\$60.00).
- (6) When the proposed Capital Stock of the Company is \$200,000 and less than \$300,000, the Fee to be Eighty dollars, (\$80.00).
- (7) When the proposed Capital Stock of the Company is \$300,000 and less than \$500,000, the Fee to be One hundred dollars, (\$100.00).
- (8) When the proposed Capital Stock of the Company is \$500,000 and upwards, the Fee to be One hundred and twenty dollars, (\$120.00).

5. All Fees must be paid in cash or by an accepted cheque, payable to the order of the Receiver General or Deputy Receiver General, and must be transmitted by Registered Letter.
