1. The Honorable the Provincial Secretary is hereby designated as the Officer charged with the issue of Letters Patent and Supplementary Letters Patent; and the Department of the Honorable the Provincial Secretary as the Department through which such issue shall take place.

2. The signatures of the Subscribers to the Petition for Letters Patent or Supplementary Letters Patent or to the Memorandum of Association, shall be verified by affidavit to the satisfaction of the Provincial Secretary.

3. The forms in Schedule, A, B and C. are hereby approved and adopted as the forms to be used under Sections five, eleven and sixteen of the said Act respectively.

4 The following is the Schedule of Fees payable under the 87th Section of the said Act:—

- (1) When the proposed Capital Stock of the Company is \$10,000 or less, the Fee to be Twenty dollars, (\$20.00).

- (7) When the proposed Capital Stock of the Company is above \$300,000 and less than \$500,000, the Fee to be One hundred dollars, (\$100.00).
- (8) When the proposed Capital Stock of the Company is above \$500,000, the Fee to be One hundred and twenty dollars, (\$120.00).
