1. The proposed corporate name of the said Company is "THE FREDERICTON ELECTRIC LIGHT COMPANY."

2. The objects of the Company are to acquire by purchase, lease or otherwise, and to use and employ machinery, apparatus and instruments, and rights relating thereto, and any patents of invention of or affecting the same, or any improvements thereof, for the production and distribution of Electricity for the purposes of light in the City of Fredericton, with such other privileges as are incident and appurtenant to the attainment of the objects and purposes above named.
