THE SUPREME COURT IN EQUITY.

Between Amos Ogden, Plaintiff; and

WHEREAS it has been made to appear by affidavit to the satisfaction of me, the undersigned, one of the Judges of the Supreme Court, that Rupert T. Anderson, Earnest L. Anderson, and Jesse A.
