

Judicial Notice

To the Creditors of the Central Bank of Canada.

PURSUANT to "The Winding Up Act," Revised Statutes of Canada, Chapter 129, and two Winding up Orders of the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice, made in the matter of the Winding up Act, being Chapter 129 of the Revised Statutes of Canada, and of "The Central Bank of Canada," and bearing date the 16th and 30th days of December, A. D. 1887, the creditors of the above "The Central Bank of Canada," formerly carrying on the business of banking in the City of Toronto, Province of Ontario, and elsewhere, are, on or before Monday the twentieth day of February, A.
