NOTICE is hereby given, that the undersigned will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant Governor in Council for Letters Patent, incorporating them a Company under and by virtue of the powers and provisions of the Statute and the Act of the General Assembly for the Province of New Brunswick, made and passed in the 48th year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lady, Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act respecting the Incorporation of Joint Stock Companies by Letters Patent."

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "MARITIME MACHINE AND CAR COMPANY."

2.
