Applications to Parliament.

RULES RELATING TO NOTICES FOR PRIVATE BILLS.

All applications for Private Bills, properly the subjects of legislation by the Parliament of Canada, within the purview of "The British North America Act, 1867," whether for the erec-tion of a Bridge, the making of a Railroad, Turnpike Road or tion of a Bridge, the making of a Railroad, Turnpike Road or Telegraph Line; the construction or improvement of a Harbour, Canal, Lock, Dam or Slide, or other like work; the granting the right of Ferry; the incorporation of any particular Trade or Calling, or of any Banking or other Joint Stock Company; or otherwise for the granting to any individual or individuals, any exclusive or peculiar rights or privileges whatever, or for doing any matter or thing which, in its operation, would affect the rights or property of other parties, or relate to any particular class of the community; or for making any amendment of a like nature to any former Act, shall require a notice, clearly and dis-tinctly specifying the nature and object of the application, and (except in the case of existing corporations) signed by, or on behalf of the applicants, to be published as follows, viz :--

In the Provinces of Quebec and Manitoba.

A notice inserted in the Canada Gazette, in the English and French languages, and in one newspaper in the English and one in the French language in the District affected, or in both languages in one paper, if there be but one in the said District, or if there be no paper published therein, then in both languages, in a paper in the nearest District in which a newspaper is pub-lished.

In any other Province or Territory.

A notice inserted in the Canada Gazette, and in one newspaper published in the County, or District, or Union of Counties affected, or if there be no paper published therein, then in a newspaper in the nearest County or District in which a newspaper is published. Such notices to be continued in each case, for a period of two months during the interval of time between the close of the next preceding Session and the consideration of the Petition. And copies of the newspapers containing the first and last insertion of such notice shall be sent to the Clerk of each House.

When a Petition is for leave to bring in a Private Bill for the erection of a Toll Bridge, the petitioner or petitioners, upon giving the notice prescribed by the preceding Rule, shall also, and in the same manner, time at the same give notice of the rates which they intend to ask; the extent of the privilege, the height of the arches, the interval between the abutments or piers, for the passage of rafts and vessels, and whether they intend to erect a drawbridge, and the dimensions of the same. Any person seeking to obtain any Private Bill shall, eight days before the meeting of Parliament, deposit with the Clerk of the House, in which the Bill is to originate, a copy of such Bill in

translating and printing the same-600 copies to be printed English, and 200 copies in French-the translation to be done the officers of the House, and the printing by the contractor. he applicant shall be also required to pay the Clerk of the Sen-e, or the Accountant of the House of Commons (as the case y be), a sum of \$200 and the cost of printing the Act in the atutes, and lodge the receipt of the same with the Clerk of the mmittee to which such Bill is referred—such payment to be ide immediately after the second reading, and before the nsideration of the Bill by such Committee.

The fee payable on any private Bill is paid only in the House which it originates.

No Petition for a Private Bill is received by either House after first ten days of the Session.

DITIONAL RULES OF THE HOUSE OF COMMONS RESPECT-ING PRIVATE BILLS.

Il Private Bills for Acts of Incorporation shall be so framed to incorporate by reference the *clauses* of the *General Acts* ating to the details to be provided for by such Bills;—special bunds shall be established for any proposed departure from s principle, or for the introduction of other provisions as to h details, and a note shall be appended to the Bill indicating provisions thereof, in which the General Act is proposed to departed from ;-Bills which are not framed in accordance th this *Rule*, shall be re-cast by the promoters, and reprinted their expense, before any Committee passes upon the uses.

1 A. All Private Bills for Acts of Incorporation of, or in endment of Acts incorporating Railway Companies, shall be wn in accordance with the Model Bill adopted by the House 23rd June, 1887, copies of which may be obtained from the rk of the House.

a) The provisions contained in any Bill which are not in acd with the Model Bill, snall be inserted between the brackets, d when revised by the proper officer shall be so printed, and s which are not in accordance with this Rule shall be returned

to the promoters to be re-cast before being revised and printed; (b) Any sections of existing Acts which are proposed to be amended shall be re-printed in full with the amendments inserted in their proper places and between brackets;

(c) Any exceptional provisions that it may be proposed to insert in any Bill shall be clearly specified in the Notice of Application for the same.

51 B. No Bill for the incorporation of a Railway Company, or for changing the route of the railway of any company already incorporated, shall be considered by the Railway Committee until there has been fyled with the Committee at least one week before the consideration of the Bill :-

(a) A Map or Plan drawn upon a scale of half an inch to the (a) A Map or Flan drawn upon a scale of half an inch to the mile, showing the location upon which it is intended to construct the proposed work, and showing also the lines of existing or authorized works of a similar character within, or in any way affecting the district, or any part thereof, which the proposed work is intended to serve, and such map or plan shall be signed by the Engineer or othes prerson making the same;

(b) An exhibit showing the total amount of capital proposed to be raised for the purposes of the undertaking, and the manner in which it is proposed to raise the same, whether by ordinary shares, bonds, debentures, or other securities, and the amount of each, respectively.

RULES OF THE SENATE RELATING TO NOTICES FOR BILLS OF DIVORCE.

72. Every Applicant for a Bill of Divorce is required to give notice of his intention so to do, and to specify from whom and for what cause, by advertisements, during six months, in the Canada Gazette, and in two newspapers published in the Dis-trict, in Quebec and Manitoba, or in the County or Union of Counties or District in the other Provinces or Territories where such applicant usually resided at the time of the separation, or if the requisite number of papers cannot be found therein, then

in the adjoining District, or County, or Union of Counties. The notice for the Provinces of Quebec and Manitoba is to be published in the English and French languages.

73. A copy of the notice, in writing, is to be served at the instance of the applicant, upon the person from whom the Divorce is sought, if the residence of such person can be ascertained; and proof on declaration under the Act passed in the thirty seventh year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for the suppression of voluntary and extra-judicial oaths," of such service, or of the attempts made to e the Senate, is to be adduced before the Senate on the reading of the Petition.
