Notice to Licensees of Timber Lands.

CROWN LAND OFFICE, 10th July, 1889.

THE attention of all persons who hold Timber Licenses on Crown Lands is called to the following Regulation, embodied in each License:—

"No Spruce or Pine Trees shall be cut by any Licensee under any License, which will not make a log at least 18 feet in length and 10 inches at the small end; and if any such shall be cut, the lumber shall be liable to double Stumpage and the License be forfeited."

This is to notify all Licensees that for the future this Section will be rigidly enforced, and that no Spruce or Pine Trees smaller than the above dimensions can be legally cut for pulp-wood, stave-wood, kiln-wood, or any other purpose.
