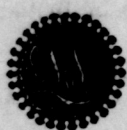

We, therefore, considering that these blessings enjoyed by Our people throughout the said Dominion do call for a solemn and public acknowledgment, have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council for Canada, to appoint, and We do appoint THURSDAY, the SEVENTH day of NOVEMBER next, as a day of General Thanksgiving to Almighty God for the bountiful Harvest with which Canada has been blessed this year; and We do invite all Our loving subjects throughout Canada to observe the said day as a day of General Thanksgiving.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent, and the Great Seal of Canada to be hereunto affixed. WITNESS, the Honorable Sir WILLIAM JOHNSTON RITCHIE, Knight, Deputy of Our Right Trusty and Well-Beloved the Right Honorable Sir FREDERICK ARTHUR STANLEY, Baron Stanley of Preston, in the County of Lancaster, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor General of Canada.

At Our Government House, in Our CITY of OTTAWA, this SEVENTH day of OCTOBER, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, and in the Fifty-third year of Our Reign.
