

### Notice of Granting Letters Patent.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Letters Patent Act," and of Chapter 10, 51st Victoria, intituled "An Act relating to the foreclosure of Mortgages on Railways," Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the tenth day of October, A. D. 1889, incorporating Robert Jones Griffiths, LL.D. of the City of London, in that part of Great Britain called England, Barrister-at-Law; William Milford Norsworthy, of London, England, Chartered Accountant; John Samuel Partridge, of South Penge Park, in the County of Surrey, England, Gentleman; Alexander Rogers, of London, England, Gentleman; and Robert O.
