CROWN LAND OFFICE, 5th March, 1890.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that the following Order was passed in Council on the 1st day of March inst .:

"Ordered, That all purchases of Crown Lands under the Act to facilitate the settlement of Crown Lands, made " prior to the 31st day of December, 1885, and not yet anted, will be cancelled on the first day of August n "and the lands again become vacant, unless the parties "interested do previously furnish the Office of Crown Lands " with the Certificate of the Labor Act Commissioner, that "the conditions of payment (by work or money), improvements and residence required by the 2nd and 3rd "Sub-sections of the Third Section of the said Act, have "been fully complied with."
