NOTICE is hereby given, that application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named, to His Honor the Lieutenant Governor in Council, for a grant of Letters Patent under the Great Seal according to the provisions of the Act of Assembly, 48th Victoria, Chapter 9, and Acts in amendment thereof, incorporating the applicants, and such other persons as may hereafter become Shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1. The proposed name of the Company is "THE EASTERN ELECTRIC COMPANY (Limited)."

To enter by its servants and employees from time to time upon any public street, square, alley or highway in the City of Saint John and adjoining Districts, and break up or open the same or any part thereof, along or across such public streets, squares, alleys or highways, for the purpose of erecting poles and posts, and stringing and erecting Electric Wires thereon, and for renewing and repairing such erections, wires or plant, subject to such limitation as the Governor in Council may prescribe.

4. The chief place of business of the Company shall be at the City of Saint John.

5. The proposed amount of capital stock of the said Company shall be \$150,000, divided into 15,000 shares of \$10 each.

6. In their application for Letters Patent, the applicants will seek permission to hold the annual meetings of the Company in the City of New York, in the United States of America.
