IN THE SUPREME COURT IN EQUITY.

The Elgin, Petitediac and Havelock Railway Company,
William Henry Thorne, and Thomas MacLellan, Defendants.

WHEREAS it has been made to appear by affidavit to the satisfaction of me, the undersigned, one of the Judges of the Supreme Court, that the above defendant, Thomas MacLellan, does not reside within the Province, so that he cannot be served with a Summons, and that his place of residence is unknown to the plaintiff, and that the above plaintiff has good *prima facie* grounds for filing a Bill against the above defendant: I do therefore hereby order, that the said defendant, on or before the twenty second day of May next, do enter an appearance in this suit, (if he intend to defend the same), wherein a Bill has been filed against the above named defendants, The Elgin, Petitediac and Havelock Railway Company, William Henry Thorne, and Thomas MacLellan, by Thomas R. Jones, the above named plaintiff, for an Account of the amount of the Bonds and Debentures secured by the Mortgage dated the second day of July, A. D. 1885, and of the amount of principal and interest due thereon; for the foreclosure and sale of the Railway lands, franchises, property, and premises conveyed by way of Mortgage by the defendant, The Elgin, Petitediac and Havelock Railway Company, to the plaintiff and the defendants, William Henry Thorne and Thomas MacLellan; for the appointment of a Receiver under the direction of this Court, to take possession of said line of Railway, lands and premises, and all other real and personal property conveyed by said Mortgage, and to operate and work said Railway under the like direction of the Court, and for such other decree as to this Honorable Court may seem meet; and unless such an appearance is so entered, the Bill may be taken *pro confesso*, and a decree made.
