And unless such an appearance is so entered, the Bill may be taken *pro confesso* against the said Warren Oliver and a Decree made. The above named defendant, Warren Oliver, is made a party to this suit by reason of his having been Assignee of the said subsidies, and having encumbered the same in favor of the plaintiffs to the extent of \$2,528.55.
