His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations:—

### GOVERNMENT NOTICE.

"IT shall be unlawful for any person or persons to dig clams on the foreshore, being the land between high and low water mark, upon any portion of Oak Bay and Waweig Bay, in the County of Charlotte, in the Province of New Brunswick, and any person digging clams upon such foreshores without a license, to be issued by the Surveyor General, or without the authority of the Licensee under any such license, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than One hundred dollars and not less than Ten dollars, which penalty may be recovered under the provisions of the Summary Convictions' Act, by any person prosecuting for the same."

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NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named, to his Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for a grant of Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893, and Acts in amendment thereof, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the said proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1. The name of the Company is to be F. B. DUNN PACKING COMPANY, Limited.

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:—

(a) To erect, maintain and operate in the City and County of St. John and Province of New Brunswick, factories, works, and

plant for the curing, preserving, condensing, separating, pressing, extracting, packing, bottling and otherwise manufacturing, handling and dealing in and with meats, fish, game, fruits, cereals and vegetables, and all farm, dairy and garden produce, and all other foods and food products, and all products and by-products thereof; to undertake, maintain and carry on all and any industry, business, undertaking, or operations, whether manufacturing or otherwise, usually undertaken or carried on at such factories, works and plant; and in connection with and for the purposes of said businesses, or any of them, or any other business of the Company, as well as for general commercial purposes, to erect, maintain and operate in the City and County of Saint John, or elsewhere in the Province of New Brunswick, abattoir plant, freezing houses and cold storage plant and other buildings, erections and plant as may be necessary, convenient, or desirable, and also to undertake and carry on the business of manufacturing cans, boxes, bottles, cases, barrels and all other goods, wares and merchandise used in or useful in connection with any of the businesses of the Company, or any business incident thereto, with power to erect, maintain and operate factories, works and plant suitable therefor.

(b) To carry on the business of importers, buyers, sellers, rearers, handlers, traders and dealers in meat, cattle, hogs, fish, game and poultry, and of all farm, garden and dairy produce, and all other food products, and in connection with the business of the Company to establish stores, agencies, depots and other markets for the purchase thereof and for the sale of the products of said businesses, as well within as without the said Province of New Brunswick, and both wholesale and retail.

(c) To carry on the trades or businesses of abattoir operators, fellmongering, tanning, warehousing, cold storage, cold storage warehousing, and the manufacture of and dealing in hides, fat, tallow, grease, fertilizers and all animal and food products and the by-products thereof.

(d) To manufacture, purchase, take on lease or otherwise acquire, own, hold, mortgage, sell, assign, transfer, invest, trade and deal in goods, wares, merchandise and property of every class and description used or dealt in or useful in connection with any of the trades or businesses aforesaid.

(e) To purchase, take on lease or in exchange, hire, or otherwise acquire any real and personal property, and any rights, franchises, easements or privileges which the Company may think necessary or convenient for the purposes of its businesses, and to purchase, take on lease, hire, construct or otherwise acquire, maintain and operate any plant, buildings, machinery, works, tramways and other conveyances by land and water, and any other plant necessary or convenient for the purposes of the company, with power to let, sell, mortgage, pledge, hypothecate or otherwise dispose of all or any of the real and personal property, rights and credits and other possessions of the company, or any part or parts thereof, with power also to sell the undertakings of the company.

(f) To carry on any other business, whether manufacturing or otherwise, which may seem to the company capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with the above or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of or render profitable any or the company's property or rights.

(g) To do all and everything necessary, suitable or convenient or proper for the accomplishment of any of the purposes or the attainment of any one or more of the objects herein enumerated, or incidental to the powers herein named, or which shall at any time appear conducive or expedient for the protection or benefit of the corporation, either as holders of or as interested in any property or otherwise.

(h) To do any and all things above set forth as objects, purposes, powers, or otherwise, and all things incidental thereto, to the same extent and as fully as natural persons might or could do as principals, agents, contractors, trustees or otherwise.

3. The office or principal place of business is to be in the City and County of Saint John aforesaid.

4. The amount of the capital stock of the company is to be One hundred thousand dollars, divided into one thousand shares of One hundred dollars each.
