NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made for Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act 1893," and amending Acts, granting a Charter constituting the applicants hereinafter named and other persons who may become shareholders in the Company thereby created, a body corporate and politic for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1. The name of the Company is to be THE CURRIE BUSINESS UNIVERSITY, (Limited).

2. The incorporation of the Company is sought for Literary and Scientific objects as follows:—

(a) To teach and promulgate the art or science of Bookkeeping, Accounting, Auditing, Banking, Commercial Law, Mathematics, Penmanship, Grammar, Orthography, Stenography, Typewriting, Composition, Telegraphy, Technology, Music, Physical Culture, Foreign Languages, and all kindred subjects and branches, and to confer and issue certificates and diplomas of proficiency therein.

(b) To hire and employ Lecturers, Teachers, Assistants, Clerks, Agents and other suitable persons to teach and instruct students and scholars and carry on the business of the institution and its branches.

(c) To establish and conduct branch schools or institutions for the above named objects and purposes in different places in the Province.

(d) To establish, have and maintain special Departments or Bureaus for employment, stenographic, typewriting and auditing purposes, and teaching by correspondence.

(e) To co-operate with public and private schools, academies, seminaries, colleges, universities and other institutions throughout the Province in supplying departmental lecturers, teachers, systems and special devices for the purpose of training persons in the foregoing commercial and technical subjects and branches.

(f) To publish, purchase, sell, rent and deal in Books, Pamphlets, Papers, Devices, Furnishings, Machines, Specialties and Systems

used in teaching the above subjects and branches or in connection with general office equipment.

(g) To purchase, acquire, have, receive, lease and hold all such real and personal property, and to erect and build all such buildings as may be necessary to conduct the business and carry out the objects and purposes of the Company, and to mortgage hypothecate, sell or in any way dispose of all or any of the Company's property, rights, interests or possessions as may be deemed desirable by the Company.

(h) To do all and everything incident, usual or necessary for the establishment, equipment and conducting of an institution and its branches for the objects and purposes above set forth.

3. The office or principal place of business is to be at the City of Saint John, in the County of the City and County of Saint John.

4. The amount of the capital stock of the Company is to be \$30,000, divided into 30,000 shares of One dollar each.

GOVERNMENT NOTICE.

THE COMMITTEE of the Executive Council having had under consideration the provisions of the Act 2 Edward VII., Chapter XXVII., wherein it is provided that the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council be "authorized by Order-in-Council to declare the percentage of proof spirits in beer and other similar liquids, which will render the same intoxicating within the meaning of 'The Liquor License Act, 1896,' and upon such Order being made the Provincial Secretary shall publish a copy of such Order in the ROYAL GAZETTE, of which Order and the publication thereof, all Courts shall take judicial notice, and thereafter, any such beer or other liquids containing such or a greater percentage of proof spirits than that mentioned in such Order-in-Council shall be deemed to be intoxicating liquors within the meaning of the said Act. Before making such Order-in-Council the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council shall satisfy himself by expert evidence as to what is the proper limit of percentage of proof spirits in beer or other similar liquids to warrant the same being classed as non-intoxicating."

And deeming it advisable and in the interests of temperance that the percentage of proof spirits in beer and other similar liquids which will render the same intoxicating within the meaning of the said Act, be declared:

And having become satisfied by expert evidence as to what should be the proper percentage of proof spirits in such beer and other similar liquids to warrant the same being classed as non-intoxicating, do hereby recommend that from and after the passing of this Order-in-Council the percentage of proof spirits in beer and other similar liquids, which will render the same intoxicating within the meaning of the said "The Liquor License Act, 1896," must be equivalent to two and one-quarter per cent. absolute alcohol by weight, and any beer or other similar liquids containing not more than two and one-quarter per cent. of absolute alcohol by weight, shall not be deemed to be within the provisions of the said "The Liquor License Act, 1896."

And His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor concurring herein, It is accordingly so Ordered.
