D. 1903, incorporating William C. Milner, of the City of Halifax, in the Province of Nova Scotia, Gentleman; Frederick A. Dixon, of Sackville, in the County of Westmorland, in the Province of New Brunswick, School Teacher; S. Edgar Dixon, of Sackville aforesaid, Farmer; J. Lea Dixon, of Sackville aforesaid, Accountant; and Walter J. Dixon, of Sackville aforesaid, Farmer; for the following purposes, namely:—
