NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named, to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, for a Grant of Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and Acts in amendment thereof, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the said proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter named and set out.

1. The name of the Company is to be "The J. A. HUMPHREYS COMPANY, (Limited)."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:—The buying, selling, trading, importing, exporting and otherwise dealing in (both at wholesale and by retail) all kinds of dry goods, groceries, hardware, ironware, tinware, paints, oils, glass, putty, lime and generally all builders' material, carpets, oil cloths, furniture, china, glass, earthenware and crockery, boots, shoes, leather and rubber goods of all kinds, hats, caps, and fur goods, ladies' and gents' furnishings, including ready and custom made clothes, millinery and materials for the same. And also gold and silverware, including watches, clocks and jewelry, of all kinds, fancy goods, books, periodicals and stationery. And also fruits, fresh, dried and preserved, confectionery, canned goods, temperate and soft drinks and beverages, cigars and cigarettes, pipes and smokers' sundries and supplies. And also meats, including beef, pork and poultry, butter, cheese and provisions of all kinds, flour, meal, including all farm and country produce and supplies for same, agricultural implements and generally all machinery and implements used in agricultural pursuits, hay, straw and grain, heavy feed, bran and shorts, potatoes and other roots. And also timber, lumber, manufactured and unmanufactured, deal, scantling, boards, clap boards, laths, shingles and house fittings of all kinds, woodenware, wood, coal and other fuel. And also in the furtherance and not in any way in limitation of the above mentioned objects and purposes or of any

general powers conferred by said above mentioned Acts, dress-making, tailoring, the manufacturing of leather goods of all kinds, watchmaking and repairing of the same, with any and all branches and subjects of trading, manufacturing and dealing, carried on or conducted, in, about, or in connection with town, village, country or departmental shops or stores. And also full right, power and authority to buy, purchase, sell, lease, hold, possess, occupy, rent and mortgage or convey any and all real and personal estate and property, whatsoever, in said Province, which shall or may be found or considered by such Company requisite, necessary or desirable, or expedient in, to or for any branch or kind of trade or business carried on or engaged in, by or for such Company. And also the doing and having done all such acts, matters or things as shall or may be conducive or incidental to the carrying out, furtherance or promotion of the above mentioned objects and purposes or any of them.

3. The principal place of business is to be at Sussex, in the Parish of Sussex, in the County of Kings, in the Province of New Brunswick.
