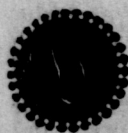

Now KNOW YE, that We do, by and with the advice of Our
Privy Council for Canada, proclaim and declare that Tuesday, the
Twenty-fourth day of May, in the year of Our Lord one thousand
nine hundred and four, is hereby fixed as the day for the cele-
bration of Our said Birthday. Nevertheless it is Our pleasure
that the usual salute in honour of our said Birthday should be
fired at all Military Stations on the Ninth day of November next.

Of all which Our loving subjects and all others whom these
presents may concern, are hereby required to take notice and to
govern themselves accordingly.

be made Patent and the Great Seal of Canada to be here-
