

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for a grant of Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick according to the provisions of the New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893, and the Acts in amendment thereof, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed company, a body politic and corporate under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.
