### MEMORANDUM.

#### THE RHODES SCHOLARSHIPS IN CANADA.

THE Trustees of the Will of the late Mr. C. J. Rhodes have  
prepared the following Memorandum for the information of  
College Authorities and intending candidates for Scholarships  
in Canada.

The first election of scholars in Canada under the Rhodes  
bequest will be made between February and May, 1904. The  
elected Scholars will commence residence in October, 1904.

A qualifying examination will be held within this period in  
each province, or at centres which can be easily reached.  
This examination is not competitive, but is intended to give  
assurance that all candidates are fully qualified to enter on a  
course of study at Oxford University.

It will therefore be based on the requirements for Respon-  
sions—the first public examination exacted by the university  
from each candidate for a degree.
