for building the Steel Superstructure of Oromocto "Highway Bridge," Parish of Lincoln, Sunbury Co., N. The structure consists of one through fixed truss span of 97 ft. 4½ in. from face to face of masonry walls, and one through swing draw span of 215 ft. 6 in. from face to face of masonry walls.
