GOVERNMENT NOTICE.

THE COMMITTEE of the Executive Council having had under consideration the provisions of the Act 2 Edward VII., Chapter XXVII., wherein it is provided that the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council be "authorized by Order-in-Council to declare the percentage of proof spirits in beer and other similar liquids, which will render the same intoxicating within the meaning of 'The Liquor License Act, 1896,' and upon such Order being made the Provincial Secretary shall publish a copy of such Order in the ROYAL GAZETTE, of which Order and the publication thereof, all Courts shall take judicial notice, and thereafter, any such beer or other liquids containing such or a greater percentage of proof spirits than that mentioned in such Order-in-Council shall be deemed to be intoxicating liquors within the meaning of the said Act. Before making such Order-in-Council the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council shall satisfy himself by expert evidence as to what is the proper limit of percentage of proof spirits in beer or other similar liquids to warrant the same being classed as non-intoxicating."

And deeming it advisable and in the interests of temperance that the percentage of proof spirits in beer and other similar liquids which will render the same intoxicating within the meaning of the said Act, be declared:

And having become satisfied by expert evidence as to what should be the proper percentage of proof spirits in such beer and other similar liquids to warrant the same being classed as non-

intoxicating, do hereby recommend that from and after the passing of this Order-in-Council the percentage of proof spirits in beer and other similar liquids, which will render the same intoxicating within the meaning of the said "The Liquor License Act, 1896," must be equivalent to two and one-quarter per cent. absolute alcohol by weight, and any beer or other similar liquids containing not more than two and one-quarter per cent. of absolute alcohol by weight, shall not be deemed to be within the provisions of the said "The Liquor License Act, 1896."

And His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor concurring herein, it is accordingly so Ordered.

GOVERNMENT NOTICE--PROVINCE OF NEW BRUNSWICK.

RE EXTRA PROVINCIAL CORPORATIONS.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That by Act of the Legislature of the Province of New Brunswick passed on the 9th day of May, A. D. 1903, intituled "An Act respecting the Licensing of Extra Provincial Corporations," provision is made that Companies incorporated without the Province, in respect to which no license fee is now payable under some other Provincial Statute, shall pay a license fee for doing business within the Province and shall also pay an annual license fee thereafter. The fee payable, where the capital stock does not exceed \$100,000, is \$50; where it exceeds \$100,000, \$100.

This Act will come into force on the first day of July, 1903, but will not apply to any Corporation doing business within the Province at the time of its passage, prior to the first of November, 1903.

WHEREAS it has been made to appear by affidavit to the satisfaction of me, the undersigned, one of the Judges of the Supreme Court, that Frederick W. Thompson, one of the above Defendants, does not reside within the Province so that he cannot be served with a summons, and that his place of residence cannot be ascertained by the Plaintiff, and that the above Plaintiff has good prima facie grounds for filing a bill against the above named Defendants, I do hereby order that the said Defendant, on or before the first day of August next, do enter an appearance in this suit (if he intend to defend the same) wherein a bill will be filed against the above named Defendant by the above named Plaintiff, Charles W. Hewson, for the foreclosure and sale of certain mortgaged lands and premises, mentioned and described and conveyed in and by a certain mortgage dated the fifteenth of July, A.
