PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act made and passed in the third year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act to incorporate The Beersville Coal and Railway Company," it was, amongst other things, enacted that the said Act should not go into force until the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council should by Proclamation, to be published in the Royal Gazette, declare that the same shall come into force from and after a day in such Proclamation to be named;

AND WHEREAS an Order in Council has been passed recommending that His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor do proclaim and bring into force the said Act;

Now, THEREFORE, I do hereby under and by virtue of the Act of Assembly, and under the authority of the said Order in Council, proclaim and declare that the said Act of Assembly, 3 Edward the Seventh, Chapter 94, shall go into force on TUESDAY the Eighth day of SEPTEMBER instant.

His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations:—

GOVERNMENT NOTICE.

"IT shall be unlawful for any person or persons to dig clams on the foreshore, being the land between high and low water mark, upon any portion of Oak Bay and Waweg Bay, in the County of Charlotte, in the Province of New Brunswick, and any person digging clams upon such foreshores without a license, to be issued by the Surveyor General, or without the authority of the Licensee under any such license, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than One hundred dollars and not less than Ten dollars, which penalty may be recovered under the provisions of the Summary Convictions' Act, by any person prosecuting for the same."
