GOVERNMENT NOTICE.

"IT shall be unlawful for any person or persons to dig clams on the foreshore, being the land between high and low water mark, upon any portion of Oak Bay and Waweig Bay, in the County of Charlotte, in the Province of New Brunswick, and any person digging clams upon such foreshores without a license, to be issued by the Surveyor General, or without the authority of the Licensee ander any such license, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than One hundred dollars and not less than Ten dollars, which penatly may be recovered under the provisions of the Summary Convictions' Act, by any person prosecuting for the same."
