

## NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the second day of September, A. D. 1903, incorporating William Henry Murray, of the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick, Mill Owner; John Fraser Gregory, of the same place, Mill Owner; Ranney Murray, of the City of Fredericton, in said Province, Gentleman; Helen Maria Gregory, of the City of Saint John aforesaid, Married Woman; Margaret Olivia Murray, of the said City of Saint John, Spinster; and Isabelle Louisa Murray, of the said City of Saint John, Spinster; for the following purposes, namely:—

To purchase and acquire the mercantile and manufacturing business heretofore carried on in the City of Saint John by William H. Murray and J. Fraser Gregory under the name of Murray & Gregory, with the real estate, lands and premises, and all leases, stock-in-trade, machinery, personal property, choses-in-action, and effects and assets of the said firm and the good-will of the said business, and to continue the said business; and for the manufacture, importation and sale of goods and merchandise; and for the purpose of purchasing, acquiring and owning lands, tenements, hereditaments and timber limits and lumbering on and working and farming the same and also transferring the same, if requisite; running a mill or mills and building mills, carrying on a general lumber business including logging, driving, booming, sawing, trading, manufacturing, shipping, importing, exporting, transporting, buying, selling and dealing in all kinds and classes of logs, piling, timber and lumber, paper, pulp wood and wooden materials, manufactured and unmanufactured, and all products and by-products of wood and other products and by-products derived from the operation of any plant of the Company; carrying on the business of storekeeping and trading; and generally to do all and everything necessary to do or incidental to the business of lumbering, manufacturing lumber, milling, store-keeping and farming.

And to build, take and enter into contracts for the erection painting or repairing of buildings, and to do painting and jobbing of every nature, kind and description.

To construct, develop, acquire, operate and dispose of water, steam and electric plant and power for any purpose whatever, and to lease, hire or sell such plant and power to any person, firm, corporation, city, town or village for any useful purpose.

To develop, acquire and operate water and electric power, construct dams, head and tail races, flumes, sluices, locks, piers and other works necessary in connection therewith.

To purchase, take on lease, hire, charter, construct, build, erect, make or manufacture or otherwise acquire, and to own, hold, let, operate, manage and control for use in connection with or in pursuance of any business or undertaking of the Company, or as incidental thereto, any sawmills, forges, foundries, machine shops, repair works, houses, boarding houses, booms, piers, dams, wharves, boats, barges, scows, vessels, tugs, steamers, machinery, machines, implements and other buildings, erections, craft, plant, goods, chattels and effects as may be found necessary, convenient or desirable for use or in connection with or as incidental to any business or undertaking of the Company.

To apply for, take by original grant, buy, purchase, lease or otherwise acquire and to own, hold, develop, operate, manage and control timber and lumber lands and real estate and grants, licenses, permits, lumber privileges, water privileges, patents of invention as may from time to time be required or be deemed necessary, convenient or desirable in connection with or as incidental to any business of the Company.

To acquire by original subscription or purchase, or otherwise, and to own, sell, mortgage or otherwise dispose of shares and stock, whether common or preferred, or any bonds, debentures, stock or other interest in or other obligations of any Company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of the Company hereby incorporated.

To apply for and to obtain from time to time for the purposes of the Company any ordinance, order, license, power, grant, authority, franchise, concession, right or privilege which the Legislature or the Governor in Council of any Province or any Corporation or municipal or other public body may be empowered to enact, make or grant; and to purchase or otherwise acquire by assignment, transfer or otherwise any such license, power, authority, franchise, concession, right or privilege which may have been heretofore or which may hereafter be granted to any person, firm or corporation.

To acquire and undertake the whole or any part of the business, property and liabilities of any person or Company carrying on business which this Company is authorized to carry on or possessed of property suitable for the purposes of this Company with power also to amalgamate with any such Company.

And generally for the purposes herein set forth as objects, purposes, or powers, to charter, purchase, take on lease, or in exchange, hire or to otherwise acquire any real and personal property, franchises, rights, privileges and powers, and any interest therein, and with power to sell, mortgage, lease, let, hire or otherwise part with or encumber the same or any part or parts thereof.

To sell, mortgage, lease or otherwise dispose of the undertaking of the Company, or any part thereof, or of any of the property, franchises, assets, rights or credits of the Company, for such consideration as the Company may think fit.

To purchase and acquire stock-in-trade, real and personal property, plant, effects and assets of any other person or persons, or bodies corporate now or hereafter carrying on any manufacturing or mercantile business, similar to what this Company is authorized to carry on, with the good-will of any such business, or to take security thereon, and to continue such business so acquired, and to sell and dispose of the same or of the assets thereof.

To carry on any other business, whether manufacturing or otherwise, which may be incident to the said objects of the Company.

To do any and all things above set forth as objects, purposes, powers, or otherwise, and any all things necessary, suitable, convenient, desirable or proper for the accomplishment of the purposes or the attainment of the objects or the exercise of the powers herebefore enumerated, or any of them, or of any purpose, object or power incidental to any of the same, or desirable for the benefit or protection of the Company, either as holders of or interested in any property, or otherwise, and as well without as within the said Province of New Brunswick, to the same extent and as fully as natural persons might or could do; by the name of "MURRAY & GREGORY, Limited"; with a total Capital Stock of One hundred and fifty thousand dollars, divided into one thousand five hundred shares of One hundred dollars each.

D. 1903, incorporating Thomas O. Dobson, of the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick, Merchant; Frederick J. Dobson, of the same place, Merchant; Joseph E. Dobson, of Stoney Creek, in the Parish of Hillsborough, in the County of Albert and Province aforesaid, Lumberman; Coleman W. Dobson, of Weldon, in the Parish, County and Province last aforesaid, Lumberman; and Elizabeth Dobson, of the said City of Moncton, Married Woman; for the following purposes, namely:—

To acquire and take over as a going concern, the business now carried on by T. and F. Dobson at the City of Moncton, and all or any of the assets and liabilities of that firm in connection therewith, and to carry on the same or any part thereof.

To carry on a wholesale and retail business in dry goods, groceries, hardware, and any and all other kinds of merchandise.

All Timber, Logs or other Lumber cut upon Unlicensed Crown Lands or which may be cut by any person beyond the limits of his own Berth, shall be seized and forfeited to the use of the Crown; and no Timber or Lumber shall be cut on any Berth applied for until it shall be purchased at Public Auction.
