Thanksgiving to Almighty God for the bountiful harvest and
other blessings with which Canada has been favoured this year;
and We do invite all Our loving subjects throughout Canada to
observe the said day as a day of General Thanksgiving.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, We have caused these Our Letters to
be made Patent and the Great Seal of Canada to be here-
unto affixed. **WITNESS**, Our Right Trusty and Right Well-
beloved Cousin and Councillor the Right Honourable Sir
GILBERT JOHN ELLIOT, Earl of Minto and Viscount Melgund
of Melgund, County of Forfar, in the Peerage of the United
Kingdom, Baron Minto of Minto, County of Roxburgh, in
the Peerage of Great Britain, Baronet of Nova Scotia, Knight
Grand Cross of Our Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael
and St. George, etc., etc., Governor General of Canada.

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NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under "The New
Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts,
Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Province
of New Brunswick, bearing date the eighth day of October, A. D.
1903, incorporating John F. Bridges, of Gagetown, in the County
of Queen's and Province of New Brunswick, Mariner; Arthur W.
Ebbett, of the same place, Barrister; James Chapman, of Canning,
in the said County of Queen's, Merchant; John F. McAllister, of
said Gagetown, Mariner; Bennett M. Dykeman, of Cambridge, in
the said County of Queen's, Mariner; Holland B. Bridges, of
Sheffield, in the County of Sunbury, Province aforesaid, Farmer;
Charles C. Taylor, of said Sheffield, Mariner; and Robert S. Orchard,
of the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John,
Province aforesaid, Mariner; for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase, hire, acquire, build, own, charter, navigate and
maintain steamships, sailing vessels and other kinds of craft,
including tugs, scows and barges and all equipments for the same,
for the carrying and conveyance of passengers, goods, chattels and
freights, and the towing, hauling, transporting, rafting and boom-
ing of timber upon the waters of the River Saint John, in the
Province of New Brunswick, and upon the tributaries of the said
River and other waters adjacent thereto, and any other waters,
and to prosecute and carry on the business of common carriers of
passengers and goods of all kinds, forwarders and traders, and of
wharfingers and warehousemen, with power to sell and dispose of
or mortgage said property, or any of them, and acquire others in
their stead.

To purchase, rent, hold, take, and enjoy such lands or real estate,
build, purchase, rent, take, hold and enjoy wharves, piers, docks,
warehouses, sheds, offices and other buildings within the Province
of New Brunswick and elsewhere necessary and convenient for
the purposes of the Company, with power to sell, mortgage or dis-
pose of the same and acquire others in their stead.

To carry on a general lumbering and sawmilling business, and
for such purpose to purchase, acquire, lease, hold and enjoy lands,
tenements and hereditaments, timber licenses and limits, and to
build, purchase, acquire, lease, hold and enjoy all buildings, mills,
mill privileges and machinery, plant and equipment necessary to
operate, engage and deal in the buying, manufacturing, cutting,
sawing and selling of timber and wood of all kinds, and all kinds
of wood products, and to carry on, so far as may be deemed expe-
dient, the business of general merchants and lumber operators.

To hold, purchase or otherwise acquire, sell, assign, transfer,
mortgage, pledge or otherwise dispose of shares of the capital
stock or bonds or debentures of any other corporation or corpora-
tions having objects similar to those of the Company hereby
incorporated, and while the holder thereof to exercise all the rights
and privileges of ownership, including the right to vote thereon.

To have all other powers incident, usual, necessary or convenient
for the carrying on of the objects of the Company, or any of the
same, or incident thereto by law; by the name of "J. F. BRIDGES
TUG BOAT COMPANY, Limited"; with a total Capital Stock of
Twenty thousand dollars, divided into eighty shares of Two hun-
dred and fifty dollars each.
