NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the thirteenth day of October, A. D. 1903, incorporating James Manchester, of the City of Saint John, in the Province of New Brunswick, Banker; William Bruckhof, of the same place, Merchant; George H. Waring, of the same place, Engineer; Augustus H. Hanington, of the same place, Barrister-at-Law; and Wellington L. Hamm, of the same place, Merchant; for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase and acquire and take over as a going concern the business and undertaking, plant, machinery and good-will of the Union Foundry and Machine Works in Carleton, in the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick, lately carried on by Walter H. Allan; and for carrying on and conducting the business of the said foundry and machine works and extending the same; and for the buying, selling, manufacturing, smelting, casting and working in all kinds and classes of metal and the products thereof; and the making, buying, selling and furnishing all kinds of machinery, engines, boilers, electrical machines, fittings and machinery, stoves, skates, carriages and other articles made from any kind of metal or wood; and doing and carrying on all business and transactions of every kind incident or belonging or appertaining to any of the objects or purposes aforesaid, or which could be carried on conveniently in connection therewith.

And also to build, make, operate, maintain, buy, sell, deal in and with, own, lease, pledge and otherwise dispose of ships,

vessels, scows, dredges and boats of every kind and nature whatsoever, together with all materials, articles, tools, machinery and appliances entering into and suitable or convenient for the construction or equipment thereof, and together with marine machines, boilers, machinery and appurtenances of all kinds, and tackle, apparel and furniture of all kinds; and to build, construct, repair, maintain and operate water, gas or electrical works, tunnels, bridges, viaducts, canals, wharves, piers and like works of internal improvement or public use or utility.

And also to amalgamate with or purchase and procure conveyances of and operate any other mills, manufactories, electric light companies and factories, and the merchandise, capital stock, stock-in-trade and good-will thereof, or of any persons or bodies corporate having, holding or owning the same.

And also for the purpose of generating and manufacturing electric light, power and heat, and selling, supplying and disposing of the same to others and entering into contracts for such purpose.

Also to purchase, lease, acquire, have and hold real and personal estate of all kinds, including bonds and stock of any incorporated company; and to take, acquire, have and hold security upon any real or personal property or effects whatsoever.

And also to apply for, purchase or otherwise acquire and to hold, own, use, operate, and to sell, assign or otherwise dispose of, to grant licenses in respect of or otherwise turn to account any and all inventions, patents, improvements and processes used in connection with or secured under Letters Patent of Canada or any other country; by the name of "UNION FOUNDRY AND MACHINE WORKS, Limited"; with a total Capital Stock of Forty-five thousand dollars, divided into four hundred and fifty shares of One hundred dollars each.
